REPORT CARD: HOW RESULTS ARE DETERMINED

For Terms 1 and 2, the teacher enters a percentage mark that reflects the knowledge and competencies that a student has acquired during the term (tests, assignments, projects, etc.).		For Term 3, the teacher enters a percentage mark that covers the student's learning for the term and where applicable, for the year as a whole, including any compulsory Board or MEQ exams.	It is calculated using the results of the three weighted terms (20%, 20%, 60%) and the MEQ exam* results (if applicable).
In the case of English Language Arts, Mathematics, and French as a Second Language, a subject mark is calculated on the basis of the weightings assigned to the subject-specific competencies established by MEQ (see subject table on first page).			*MEQ exam counts for 10% of the final grade in grade 6 English Language Arts and Mathematics.
